

The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Advisory Committee at a meeting held on June 24, 1992 in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM I

Harlem Road and Clinton Street

The applicant is proposing to construct a retail store at the northwest corner of Clinton Street and Harlem Road. The site is the former location of a farmers market. The applicant .had revised the plans to show additional landscaping which resulted in a smaller store building. A question arose regarding the type of vehicles that would be servicing the building since the main store would be a beverage store.

The applicant was present at this meeting and indicated that 12-bay beverage trucks are the only vehicles that service the store. Two trucks per week for beer and one or two trucks per week for pop. No semi-trucks would be delivering at the location.

The drainage for the site was discussed and the Town Engineer indicated that no final approval can be made until the New York State Department of Transportation determines what size pipe the applicant will be allowed to use in tying into the state drainage system. The size, once determined, will then dictate the on-site drainage requirements.

The applicant indicated that he had been planning on utilizing split-rib block on the east and south sides of the building and he was told to include the west side since this would be visible both from Clinton Street and the New York State Thruway.

The use of the property as proposed is consistent with the Town Master Plan and compatible with other uses surrounding the site. Therefore the committee is recommending that a Negative Declaration be issued with the conditions: decorative block on the west, south and east sides of the building; and that no building permit be issued until the New York State Department of Transportation reviews the drainage and the Town Engineer approves the on-site drainage system.

This letter and the enclosed Notice are being mailed by this office pursuant to such Town Board resolution.

In accordance with State law, the Cheektowaga Town Board enacted a local law in September of 1991 requiring property owners to pay 50% of the cost of repairing their sidewalks. This new law applies to you. Property owners, under this new law, are given the option of repairing the sidewalks themselves; if you choose to repair your own sidewalk, you must do so on or before August 5, 1992 and the Town will not reimburse you for any of these costs. If, however, you allow the Town to perform the sidewalk repair work, the Town will pay 50% of the cost of such work; you will then be billed for 50% of the actual cost for such work. Payment to the Town shall be made as follows:

- 1. On or before September 15, 1992, you may submit full payment to the Town.
- 2. If the Town does not receive full payment from you by September 15, 1992, the Town will add your cost of the sidewalk repair to your 1993 and 1994 County/Town tax bills.

The Town Highway Department will be responsible for scheduling the approved Town contractor to do the necessary sidewalk repair work. The repair work to be done to your sidewalk will be estimated by markings placed on your sidewalk by the Town Highway Department; please be advised that the actual repair work may differ from the estimated sidewalk repair work in some instances. The cost of the sidewalk repair work will also be computed by the Town Highway Department based on a cost of \$1.25 per square foot (\$25 per 20 square foot block).

I hope the above information is of some assistance to you.

Grant Agreement This Grant Agreement between the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and (name of the Grantee) Town of Cheektowaga, New York is made pursuant to the authority of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, (42 U.S.C. 5301 et seq). The Grantee's submissions for Title I assistance, the HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 570 (as now in effect and as may be amended from time to time), and the attached HUD Funding Approval, form HUD-7082 (the Funding Approval), including any special conditions, constitute part of the Agreement. Subject to the provisions of this Grant Agreement, HUD will make the funding assistance for Fiscal Year 19 92 specified in the Funding Approval available to the Grantee upon execution of the Agreement by the parties. - ll. Petitioner covenants that it will not seek relief from the assessment of SBL 103.14-4-1 for the tax years 1992-93, 1993-94 and 1994-95, provided that said assessment for those tax years is as set forth in this paragraph and in paragraphs 9 and 10 above.
- 12. The parties acknowledge that this assessment as adjusted is fair, equitable and proper for the purposes of this settlement.
- 13. The attorneys for the parties hereby stipulate to a discontinuance of each and every one of the within proceedings.
- 14. That refunds shall be computed as if to be paid with interest at the statutory interest rate pursuant to the refund computations attached hereto and made a part of this Settlement Agreement as Schedule "A".
- 15. The refunds set forth in paragraph 14 and in Schedule "A" shall be offset against the taxes now due and payable, as more fully set forth in Schedule "A".

- additions or improvements are made to SBL 103.14-4-1 after the date of this agreement and before the taxable status date for the tax assessment rolls for 1994-95, the assessment may be adjusted accordingly, in which case petitioner shall have the right to seek relief from the assessment, as adjusted. Further, should any portion of the premises be destroyed or impaired during that time, petitioner shall also have the right to seek relief from the assessment, whether or not it is adjusted.
- 17. Petitioner shall have the right to seek specific enforcement of the terms of this Settlement Agreement, and of any order entered thereupon, and to otherwise enforce such terms by whatever means provided by law.
- agreement is made only for the purpose of resolving pending litigation in order to avoid the expenses incident to such litigation and for such other reasons as the parties deem material. In no event shall this agreement, or the contents thereof, be offered or admitted in any of these proceedings if prosecution thereof is carried forward or in any other proceeding by the parties or third parties as competent evidence of any fact.
- 19. This agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement among the parties. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to bind either party beyond the tax assessment rolls established for the 1994-95 tax year.

20. The parties authorize their attorneys to seek an order of the Supreme Court approving the terms of this Settlement Agreement, and this Settlement Agreement is conditioned upon such approval.

82 Acre parcel at Scott Place and Aero Drive

Dear Gentlemen:

Ciminelli Development Company, Inc. has submitted drawings describing our plans for the development of an 82 acre parcel located at Scott Place and Aero Drive. Our initial intent is to develop the 20 Acre portion at the corner of Scott Place and Aero Drive. This area requires the placement of earth fill to create buildable sites above the 100 year storm elevation.

Our wetland delineations have identified jurisdictional wetlands in this area. We have obtained permission from The Army Corp of Engineers to fill .86 acres of wetland under Nationwide Permit 26. The 2.3 acre wetland in this area will be preserved. A letter of intent describing a wetland deed restriction and right of access has been issued.

In addition to wetland considerations, the Town of Cheektowaga, as lead agency under SEQR regulations, has received professional reports describing the existing and proposed impact to soil, groundwater, surface drainage, flood plain, vegetation, Municipal Services, hazardous waste, cultural resources, landscape, noise/air quality and traffic, etc. All reports have been assembled, catalogued and indexed for easy access and are on file at the Cheektowaga Town Hall.

The conclusions and recommendations of these studies and reports have been accepted and incorporated into our revised development plans so as to create an environmentally viable development project in the Town of Cheektowaga.

We no longer intend to cross the NYSDEC wetland known as Aero Creek with any development activities. Our plans for the area north of Aero Creek have shifted towards the creation of a proposed 20 acre wetland sanctuary, or to be left alone in its current undeveloped natural state.

Our "wetland sanctuary" proposed idea involves the creation of wetlands under current wetland mitigation rules and regulations independent of any required need to mitigate or perform any work whatsoever in this area. We intend to create a wetland in anticipation of changes in current legislation that will allow credit for "wetland banking" prior to development needs for mitigation. Our risk is that this necessary legislation will not be enacted in which case we will have created a beneficial wetland for the earth. We have offered the land area for this use, but do not have internal funds available at this time for "wetland sanctuary" creation. We are currently seeking external sources of funding and volunteers for labor.

In the event that additional buildings are developed beyond the scope of the 20 acre area located at Scott Place and Aero Drive, wetland mitigation would be required.

Sediment soil tests on the various water courses entering the site have been completed. These tests indicate that the Aero Drive site is environmentally "clean" and acceptable for normal fill and construction activities without hazardous risk.

The tree survey is complete and on file with the Town of Cheektowaga. Existing trees in the 50' perimeter area bordering our 20 acre site can be saved as indicated. We will landscape according to the Town of Cheektowaga code requirements on a project basis as indicated during future site plan approval procedures.

HEC-II flood analysis for 100 year storm conditions affect flood elevations at the maximum point by approximately +2" well with in the Army Corp tolerance of +12". Since the original site purchase, 161,333 cubic yards of fill have been removed for airport runway extension enhancing flood plain capacity. Our plans involve returning 127,000 cy of fill to the site for a net gain of flood capacity of 21%.

We have conducted traffic studies and addressed peak flow rates and capacities for both Aero Drive and Scott Place under no build, Phase I and Phase II development scenarios. Under existing and projected future development conditions, traffic volumes are expected to remain acceptable. Additional traffic study research can be conducted as specific site tenants are obtained prior to site plan approval procedures as deemed necessary the by Town of Cheektowaga.

We are requesting that the positive declaration previously received under SEQR procedures be rescinded due to our compliance with all previous environmental concerns.

Once, and if a negative declaration under SEQR is obtained and fill is placed, we intend to construct buildings on a build-to-suit the tenant basis as customers are obtained.

If customers are obtained that require different zoning then specific details can be addressed by the Town of Cheektowaga through the standard rezoning application process. As customers are obtained the specific's of their building locations and intended use details can be addressed through the standard Town of Cheektowaga site plan approval process, and the specific building details and requirements of construction can be addressed at both the building permit and certificate of occupancy stages of check and balance authorization.

This office has performed a review of the proposed Losson Park Estates Subdivision consisting of fifteen (15) lots fronting on the north side of Crabapple Lane. This subdivision represents a resubdivision of what was formerly filed as an eleven (11) lot subdivision under MC 2541 in April 1989 to accommodate the construction of eight (8) unit apartment buildings. It is my understanding that the current subdivision proposal, which was recently rezoned from RA to R, is being developed for the construction of two (2) family homes. It is also my understanding that the sanitary sewer and storm drainage located within the R.O.W. outletting to Cayuga Creek have previously been installed and accepted and that the waterline and hydrant required by the Bellevue Fire District No. 9 are in-place.

As the aforesaid infrastructure has already been constructed, our review of the plans at this time concerns itself with lot grading and drainage.

It is the recommendation of the writer that the following items be made a condition of subdivision approval to be completed prior to the issuance of building permits:

- l) Installation of all rear yard drainage as designed subject to the provisions of the Public Improvement Permit Ordinance.
- Establishment and stabilization of the embankment area along the north line of sublots 11 thru 15.

- Balancing of all sublots to within a reasonable tolerance of finish grade so that all drainage patterns are established resulting in a functional storm drainage 3) system.
- Filing of all drainage easements in conjunction with the amended Map Cover in the Erie County Clerk's Office. 4)
- That the commitment agreed to and made a condition of the 5) Town Board Resolution dated May 4, 1992 for rezoning concerning a deed restriction for the portion of the applicant's property located within the 100 year flood plain be complied with. (Copy of aforesaid resolution attached)
