- . (7) Cutting down, killing or otherwise destroying trees on residential property which was developed for residential use prior to January I, 1992 and which property has a lot area not exceeding 10,200 square feet and has a lot width not exceeding 60 feet.

If a person is required to submit a subdivision or site plan for a development of property, he shall, prior to such subdivision or site plan approval, submit an application for a tree removal permit. TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

Section 1. Findings; intent.

If any trees are unlawfully cut down, cleared, killed or otherwise destroyed by any person(s), firm(s), or corporation(s) in connection with, or preparatory to, any development, improvement or change of use, or proposed rezoning, for which a permit or permission is required by the Town, then, in addition to any other fine or penalty provided for in this law, or elsewhere, said person(s), firm(s), association(s), or corporation(s) shall not be granted such permit or permission by the Town unless and until a remedial tree planting plan for the subject premises is accepted and approved by the Town Building Inspector and/or Planning Board as part of the coordinated review process.

Section 9. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this law and shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall be rendered.





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To the Citizens of the Town of Cheektowaga:

As the Budget Officer of the Town of Cheektowaga, it is my pleasure to present this 1993 budget document. Our budget preparation procedures must comply with New York State Town Law which is explained in the "Budget Process" section of this document. In preparing the 1993 budget we have adhered to these statutes.

As has been the case for the past few years, the preparation of the Town's 1993 budget was an extremely difficult process. We feel an obligation to our residents to continue to provide high quality services, and in some cases improve such service, while facing cuts in aid and keeping tax increases to a minimum. Negative factors which continue to plague our budgetary process are:

- During 1992 State Aid revenue sharing was reduced for the third straight year.
 Chances for further cuts or complete elimination of the state revenue sharing program are strong.
- The 1993 budget refects substantial increases for employee benefits. The
 cost of healthcare insurance for Town employees has increased by
 approximately 40%, while required contributions to employee retirement have
 increased 20%. Additionally, negotiated wage increases continue to be the
 largest dollar increase over 1992
- Increases in property tax exemptions have left the Town with a negligible net taxable assessment base increase.
- The availability of General Fund fund balance has deminished over the past few years, such that we have substantially reduced our use of such in the 1993 budget.

Despite these problems we continue to focus on the positive. All departments are investigating potential efficiencies in an effort to do more with less resources. We have made the setting of goals and objectives an important part of our budget and planning process. All Town Board members, department heads, deputies and certain key personnel have been scheduled for the "Goals and Objectives Seminar". Our ultimate goal, from this process, is to develop a Town—wide list of goals and objectives from all departments, which will be published and distributed throughout the Town of Cheektowaga.

We also continue our commitment to being open and available to all residents, and to full and fair disclosure of financial results. The Town's 1991 annual comprehensive annual financial report was awarded a Certificate of Acheivement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Govenrment Finance Officers Association. This is the fourth year in a row the Town has received this award, which signifies that the Town published a report which was easily readable, efficiently organized and in conformance with program standards.

I thank you for your attention and interest in this document and invite your comments and suggestions at any time.

BUDGET PROCESS

The budget preparation process is heavily governed by New York State statutes. Town Law Sections 103 through 113 define the statutory restrictions placed on the budget process.

In the Town of Cheektowaga the Supervisor serves as the Budget Officer and has the responsibility for the preparation of the initial budget called the "Tentative Budget". Following the Supervisor's submission of this budget to the Town Board (through the Town Clerk) a number of budget work sessions are held by the Town Board. The Town Board then approves a second draft of the budget called the "Preliminary Budget". They also call for a public hearing on this "Preliminary Budget".

Following the public hearing, further work sessions are held before the Town Board approves an "Adopted Budget", which is filed with Erie County. A budget calendar is included herein which outlines the action dates for the process.

This process provides substantial opportunity for public input. The initial departmental estimates are generally based on each department head's dealings with the public and their service needs. These are often discussed throughout the year with the Town Board committee chairperson governing that department. When the Supervisor files his initial budget a press release is made and a press conference held. This provides the basic source of data for public consideration prior to the formal budget public hearing. Town Board work sessions are generally open to interested public as well. All detailed versions of the budget are available for public inspection in the Town Clerk's office.

Throughout the year a simple majority vote of the Town Board is required to amend budgetary line items. Nearly all appropriation line items are subject to transfer with the primary exception being debt service line item appropriations.

Budget monitoring is provided through the use of a full encumbrance accounting. The Town computer system generates budgetary status reports on demand, but at least monthly. These are distributed to Department heads as well as the full Town Board. At the end of the eighth month in the fiscal year a forecast of budgetary performance is reviewed by independent certified public accountants. This report

becomes the basis for fund balance estimates to be used in the upcoming budget preparation. Audited financial statements at year end include budget and actual comparisons. They become part of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, which has been awarded the Government Finance Officers Association "Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting". These year end reports are available for public inspection in the Town Clerk's office.

General budgetary performance will also be monitored through the use of comparative statistics and data generated by various sources such as:

Government Finance Officers Association New York State Comptroller's Office Inter-City Management and Municipal Analysis Services Erie County Commissioner of Finance

Budget Policy

Throughout the budgetary development process, the Supervisor and Town Board strive for the consistent application of the following budgetary objectives:

- Full compliance with New York State statutory requirements.
- 2) Equitable assessment of costs to benefitted citizenry primarily through use of special districts and user charges.
- 3) Appropriations to be made in sufficient detail to facilitate effective departmental accountability.
- 4) Four basic program priorities to be funded are:

Police Sanitary Sewerage Sanitation (Solid Waste) Highway development and maintenance

- 5) Indebtedness to be issued only for projects having minimal useful life of five years (Indebtedness not to exceed 20% of statutory maximum).
- 6) Significant (10% or more) fluctuations in annual appropriations must be justified by documented changes in service levels.

These budgetary objectives have been developed over the past five years. They reflect generalized goals which have been agreed upon during various aspects of the annual budget process over that time period. The need to comply with State statutes is obvious.

As budgetary pressures upon local government increased it was deemed important to direct the costs of services to those benefitted. This is facilitated in New York State through the use of Special Districts which are geographic portions of the Town established to provide specific services for limited segments of the Town. These districts are used in the areas of sanitation, lighting, sanitary sewerage, water lines, storm and drainage as well as hydrants.

The desire for accountability led to Town Board member Functional Committee Chairmen determining the level of budgetary detail required by their departments to facilitate accurate monitoring.

The identification of four key programs as top priority was deemed necessary to simplify the appropriation review process. General agreement as to the funding of these areas is required before discussion of the many remaining departments.

Control of Town indebtedness was agreed upon in an effort to minimize fluctuations in the use of borrowings to fund capital related needs.

Town of Cheektowaga, New York Financial and Operating Structure

The Town of Cheektowaga's financial structure and accounting system maintains and reports operations in accordance with New York State's Uniform System of Accounts for Towns. The operating funds are reported in the following manner.

Each of the funds and districts above maintain a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. Town resources are allocated to and accounted for in the individual funds based upon the purpose for which they are spent. A description of the purpose for each fund is included in this document.



Generally this document contains budgets for all operating funds, exceptions to this rule and the reasons for the exceptions are:

<u>Community Development Fund (within the Special Revenue Fund)</u>
- This fund's budget is set when allocation of Federal funding is determined (which does not coincide with the Town's fiscal year), additionally these budgets lapse when the funds are exhausted (rather than at the end of any specified period).

<u>Debt Service Fund</u> - This fund's budget merely reflects the payment of debt which is budgeted for in the other operating funds. Therefore the use of these compensating controls precludes the necessity of a formal Debt Service Fund budget.

<u>Capital Projects Fund</u> - The individual projects are authorized on a project by project basis by Town Board resolution at various times during the year (as the need for the project is determined), and appropriations lapse upon completion of the project.

TOWN OF CHEE GOVERNMENTA

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund is the principal operating fund and includes all operations not required to be recorded in other funds.

SPECIAL REVENUE FUND

The Special Revenue Funds are used to account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are legally restricted to expenditures for specific purposes. These funds include:

GENERAL FUND OUTSIDE VILLAGES

The General Fund Outside Village accounts for selected services which by New York State statute cannot be charged to residents of the Villages located within the Town.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND

The Community Development Fund is used to record all activity related to the federally supported Community Development Block Grant Program.

SANITARY SEWER
DISTRICTS
(10 DISTRICTS)

Accounts for sanitary sewer services provided to Town residents within the particular geographic area (district) in which they reside.

CONSOUDATED GARBAGE DISTRICT

Accounts for refuse pickup and recycling services provided for areas within the Town.

GENERAL LIGHTING DISTRICT

Accounts for street lighting services provided for areas within the Town.

TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK DEBT MANAGEMENT

The Town utilizes short term borrowings in the form of bond anticipation notes, and long term debt in the form of serial bonds as a means of financing Capital Projects only. Debt is not utilized to finance the current operations of the Town.

Under Section 104 of the Law of Towns of New York State the Town is limited in the amount of debt it may issue. The legal debt limit is computed by obtaining the average full valuation of the Town for the past five years and multiplying by 7%. Debt related to providing water and sewer facilities may be excluded from the debt limit. The Town's percentage of debt contracting power exhausted at December 31, 1991 was 12.9% and is estimated to be approximately the same at December 31, 1992.

As stated in the "Budget Policy" section the Town Board has decided not to exceed 20% of the statutory debt limit. This should minimize fluctuations in the use of borrowings to fund capital related need, and smooth future debt service requirements. Additionally, this should assist in protecting the Town's bond rating, which at the time of our last debt issuance was A (Moody's Investors Service).

The following pages contain amortization schedules for the Town's current serial bonds outstanding. These schedules show the future impact on the operating funds (through principal and interest payments) for debt previously issued.

At 1993 taxable assessment levels, \$100,000 of funds appropriated for principal and interest in either the General or Highway Funds will result in a property tax of \$.042. Due to the complex benefit formulas and user fees employed in the other funds and special districts, it is not possible to project tax impacts of debt service costs.



Transfers Amounts distributed from one fund to finance the activities

User Charges The payment of a fee for direct receipt of public service by

the party benefiting from the service.







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THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, New York (herein called "Town"), is hereby authorized to construct an extension to Wedgewood Drive to connect Wedgewood Drive with Losson Road, within the Town, including, where required, sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drainage, landscaping, and all ancillary work required in connection therewith. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$130,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$130,000 serial bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the

taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$130,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law") to finance said appropriation.

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Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose for which said \$130,000 serial bonds authorized pursuant to this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 20.(c) of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.103-18 of the United States Treasury Department.



BETWEEN

THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND ASSISTANT CHIEF OF POLICE

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into the 23rd day of November , 1992, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, hereinafter referred to as the "Town" and the CHIEF OF POLICE AND ASSISTANT CHIEF OF POLICE, hereinafter referred to as the "Chief".

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have previously entered into agreement setting forth the various terms and conditions of employment for the positions of Chief of Police and Assistant Chief of Police, AND

WHEREAS, the last agreement between the parties expired by its terms on December 31, 1991; AND

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of entering into a successor agreement setting forth terms and conditions of employment for the calendar year 1992;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED as follows:

- 1.) The provisions of this Agreement shall be effective for the calendar year 1992, commencing January 1, 1992.
- 2.) Both the Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief shall each receive the sum of \$875.00 in 1992 for the purchase and maintenance of police clothing, uniforms and equipment. The Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief shall be responsible for the maintenance of their uniforms and equipment.
- 3.) The Chief of Police shall receive as salary for the year 1992 the sum of \$59,644.87.
- 4.) The Assistant Chief of Police shall receive as salary for the year 1992 the sum of \$54,035.47.
- 5.) That upon each person's anniversary date of hire, the Chief of Police and Assistant Chief of Police shall receive as a longevity payment the following:

Chief......\$1,375.00 Assistant Chief.....\$1,375.00

- 6.) The work of both the Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief of Police shall consist of variable hours, dependent upon other things, his duties, meetings to be attended and the needs of the Department. Both the Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief of Police shall work an amount of hours at least equal to that of the Captain or Lieutenant working the most number of hours during the year. The hours worked shall be documented by a daily attendance record, signed and attested to by the Chief of Police. In recognition of the variable hours, both the Chief of Police and Assistant Chief of Police shall receive an additional sum of \$2,324.07 in 1992, to be added to the salaries set forth above and pro-rated with his regular salary on a weekly basis.
- 7.) The Chief and the Assistant Chief of Police shall receive compensatory time off or be paid the value of the certain holidays granted to the members of the Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc., whether each works the holiday(s) or not.
- 8.) The Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief of Police shall be allowed, as annual vacation, with pay, the following number of days:

After fifteen (15) years of service.....27 working days After twenty (20) years of service.....30 working days

In the event either the Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police shall have at least seventeen (17) years of service, he may elect to be paid the value of up to twenty (20) days of accumulated vacation in lieu of time off. In such an event, the individual shall notify the Town of such before November 15th and payment for such shall be made prior to December 31st.

- 9.) Upon the retirement of either the Chief of Police or Assistant Chief of Police, the individual shall be paid the monetary value of any accrued vacation time or compensatory time to his credit. In the event of the death of either the Chief of Police or the Assistant Chief of Police, the payment of such shall be made to his estate.
- 10.) Upon prior request, notification and approval, both the Chief and Assistant Chief of Police shall be entitled to paid bereavement leave days of up to five (5) per occurrence in the event of death of his: parents, spouse, child, grandchild, grandparent, brother, sister or in-law relative.
- 11.) The Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief of Police shall each be entitled to five (5) personal leave days per calendar year, which days shall be non-cumulative. In the event such days are unused at the end of the calendar year, they shall be credited to the individual's accumulated vacation or sick leave, at the individual's option.

- 12.) Both the Chief of Police and the Assistant Chief of Police will earn and accumulate sick leave at the rate of one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ days per month, to a maximum of three hundred (300) days. In the event the maximum accumulation is reached, either individual may sell back to the Town any days in excess thereof, up to a maximum of nine (9) days, as long as the amount of accumulation remains at 300 days after such sell back.
- 13.) In the event of the use of sick leave in excess of six (6) consecutive working days, the Town may require a medical statement attesting to the individual's sickness or injury.
- 14.) In the event either the Chief of Police or the Assistant Chief of Police has exhausted all accumulated sick leave, the Town Board, in its sole discretion, may grant additional sick leave, not to exceed ninety (90) additional days, upon terms and conditions the Town Board may deem proper and necessary.
- 15.) In the event the Chief of Police or the Assistant Chief of Police is injured or is taken sick in the performance of his duties, he shall be entitled to the benefits as set forth in Section 207(c) of the General Municipal Law of the State.
- 16.) The Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police will be entitled to use sick leave in the event of his sickness or injury, or the sickness or injury of his spouse, if residing in the same household, or minor children or step-children.
- 17.) One (1) year prior to retirement, the Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police may convert any accumulated sick leave into cash by written application to the Town signifying his intention to retire. Such application shall be delivered to the Town Board. The conversion of accumulated sick leave into cash shall be at the rate of sixty-five (65%) percent during 1992.
- 18.) In the event the Chief of Police or the Assistant Chief of Police is required to leave the geographic limits of the Town as a result of either of their employment, he shall be reimbursed for his actual, reasonable and necessary expenses, including and not limited to all meals while on official police business. The Town shall provide the Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police with transportation.
- 19.) The Town will continue to provide both the Chief and the Assistant Chief of Police with a \$25,000 group life insurance policy.
- 20.) The Town will continue to provide the Chief and the Assistant Chief of Police with medical, dental and vision insurance on a level at least equal to that provided to the Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc. In the event of the death of the

Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police while employed by the Town, the Town will continue to provide such insurance coverage to his surviving spouse and dependents, if any, until such time as the surviving spouse should remarry, die or become eligible for insurance coverage through the spouse's employment. Upon retirement of either the Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police, the Town will continue to provide such insurance to the individual until age 65, at which time it will provide the applicable insurance coverage as medicare supplemental coverage.

- 21.) The Town will continue to provide to the Chief and the Assistant Chief of Police a non-contributory retirement plan, as previously agreed.
- 22.) In the event of disciplinary action or complaints against the Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police, the individual will be provided of any documents entered into his personal file and shall be afforded the opportunity to respond thereto.
- 23.) The Town will pay the full cost of tuition, fees and books for any previously authorized police science course or seminars attended.
- 24.) The Chief or the Assistant Chief of Police will be granted a leave of absence, with or without pay, as provided for pursuant to the Civil Service Law of the State of New York.
- $\,$ 25.) The Town will continue to provide payroll savings plan and U.S. Savings Bond payroll deduction, as previously agreed to.
- 26.) The Chief and the Assistant Chief of Police shall be entitled to educational incentive as follows. For an Associate Art and Science Degree (two-year program) in a New York State Department of Education approved police science or justice program, the sum of \$200.00; for a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Degree in a New York State Department of Education approved police science or criminal justice program, the sum of \$500.00; for a Master's Degree or better in a New York State Department of Education approved police science or criminal justice program, the sum of \$600.00.
- 27.) This agreement shall become effective January 1, 1992 and remain in full force and effect until December 31, 1992.

ENGINEERING SERVICES AGREEMENT

TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

ERIE COUNTY

TOWN-WIDE TRAFFIC STUDY

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 23 day of November, 1992, by and between the Town of Cheektowaga, in the State of New York, a municipal corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York with offices located at the Town Hall, Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York 14227, hereinafter referred to as the "Town" and EMS Consulting, a domestic firm with a staff duly licensed to practice professional engineering in the State of New York with offices at 1863 Clinton Street, Buffalo, New York 14206, hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, there are several major traffic corridors and traffic congestion areas within the Town of Cheektowaga that need to be addressed to alleviate congestion and potential safety problems and promote economic growth. Many of the traffic problem areas are the result of resent growth within the Town of Cheektowaga and surrounding Towns. In addition, there are also several planned developments that will contribute to the congestion by significantly changing traffic patterns and generating new vehicle trips; AND

WHEREAS, There is a need to conduct a town-wide traffic study to better identify the traffic congestion and potential safety problem problems and prepare short and long range plans to alleviate the existing and anticipated future problem areas; AND WHEREAS, said improvements are essential to minimize traffic congestion, promote traffic safety and encourage economic growth within the Town of Cheektowaga; AND

WHEREAS, 1992-1993 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) of the Niagara Frontier Transportation Committee includes a study to evaluate present and future traffic conditions in the Town of Cheektowaga at the request of the Town of Cheektowaga; AND

WHEREAS, the Town's share of the study for Engineering Services shall be charged to the 1992 Community Development Block Grant account, AND

WHEREAS, by resolution of the Town Board of Cheektowaga dated NOV. 23, 1992, the proposal by the Engineer is accepted as the basis for this agreement; AND

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

The Town hereby retains the Engineer to furnish the Engineering Services set forth in this Agreement upon the terms and conditions set forth herein and the Engineer hereby agrees to perform such services in accordance herewith. All services performed by the Engineer shall be done in a professional manner and in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

SECTION I - SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of the Engineering Services to be provided under this Agreement are contained in a letter dated November 3, 1992 from EMS Consulting to Chester Bryan, Town of Cheektowaga Engineer. The November 3, 1992 letter is included in Appendix 'A' of this Agreement.

SECTION II - GENERAL PROVISIONS - ENGINEER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Engineer agrees to perform and complete the services listed in Section I, including normal civil, electrical, and traffic engineering services where related thereto, as set forth below and contained within this Agreement.
- B. The Engineer has, or will secure, at his own expense, all personnel, equipment and facilities as necessary to accomplish the work.
- C. The Engineer agrees to secure, at his own cost, and maintain in force during the life of the contract, the following insurance coverages:
 - 1. Comprehensive General Liability affording bodily injury, personal injury and property damage liability coverage with a \$1,000,000 aggregate limit of liability.
 - 2. Worker's Compensation and Disability Benefits affording statutory limits for all states in which work hereunder is to be performed.
 - 3. Professional Liability with an aggregate limit of \$1,000,000.
- D. The Town has entered into this Agreement in order to receive the professional services of the Engineer. The Engineer will, therefore, not make any assignment to the third party of all or any portion of the services required under this Agreement without first obtaining the written consent of the Town.
- E. The Engineer, his agents and employees shall at all times conduct themselves consistent with their status as independent consultants and shall not represent themselves as employees or agents of the Town.
- F. The Engineer shall in all respect comply with the pertinent provisions of the laws, rules and regulations of the United States, the State of New York, the County of Erie and Town of Cheektowaga. The Engineer shall also comply with all Federal Requirements for the Community Development Block Grant Program as outlined in Appendix 'B' of this Agreement.
- G. Since the Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, or over subcontractor's estimates, his opinion of probable Project Cost provided for herein is to be made on the basis of his experience and qualifications and

represents his best judgment as a design professional familiar with the industry; but the Engineer cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or the construction cost will not

vary from opinions of probable cost prepared by him.

H. The Town Engineer and Engineer have discussed the risks, rewards and benefits of the project and the Engineer's total fee for services. The risks have been allocated such that the Town agrees that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the Engineer's total liability to the Town for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, damages or claims expenses arising out of this agreement from any cause or causes, shall not exceed the total amount of the Engineer's fee for this project. Such causes include but are not limited to the Engineer's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or breach of warranty.

I. All approved original drawings prepared by the Engineer shall remain in the office of the Engineer or on file at the New York State Department of Transportation. Any reproduction tracings required by the Town will be furnished at cost as requested.

J. The Town Engineer shall act as the Town's representative in respect to the Engineer's services. He shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information and interpret and define the Town's policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment elements and systems pertinent to the Engineer's services.

SECTION III - COMPENSATION

For services rendered under this contract, fees and payment will be paid by the Town to the Engineer based the schedule set forth in the November 3, 1992 letter contained in Appendix 'A' of this Agreement and as outlined below.

Direct Technical Labor Costs - The direct labor costs shall be based on the actual hourly rate paid by the Engineer and the number of hours spent by the Engineer while working directly on the project.

Overhead Rate - The overhead rate shall be 70 percent for the Engineer and 100 percent for the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Subconsultant. The overhead rate shall be applied to actual Direct Technical Labor costs.

Other Direct Costs - The Town shall be billed for the actual cost of direct costs other than labor, such as report printing. The mileage cost for the Engineer's personnel will be \$0.21 per mile for travel beyond a 50 mile radius of the project.

Fixed Fee - The fixed fee for the Engineer and the Subconsultant shall be as shown on Chart 1 in the November 3, 1992 letter included in Appendix 'A'. The payment of the fixed fee shall be proportionate to the time spent on this project and the term of this Agreement.

Maximum Fee - The maximum fee payable under this agreement shall be \$50,000.00.

Payment - Payment shall be made on monthly billings.

SECTION IV - TIME OF COMPLETION

The terms of this Agreement shall commence upon the date of execution of the Agreement and shall terminate on completion of the services and acceptance thereof by the Town. The time to complete the this project is 12 months unless a time extension is approved by the Town Engineer.

SECTION V - GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Extra Work

If the Engineer is of the opinion that any work he has been directed to perform is beyond the scope of this Agreement and constitutes extra work, he shall promptly notify the Town of the fact. If the Town agrees that such work does constitute extra work, it shall provide extra compensation to the Engineer upon a fair and equitable basis. A Supplemental Agreement providing for such compensation for extra work shall be prepared and executed by the Engineer and the Town.

B. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party by seven days written notice. If this Agreement is so terminated the Engineer shall be paid for work completed on the basis of mutual agreement by the parties as to the work completed prior to termination. In the event of any termination, the Engineer shall be paid all terminal expenses resulting therefrom.

Our firm has conducted the previous TSM studies for the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Tonawanda under contracts with the New York State Department of Transportation. We specialize in traffic engineering and highway design. We typically conduct over 25 traffic studies a year and design an average of 5 highway projects each year. Our expertise in highway design complements our experts in traffic studies and vice versa. We have two people that spend full time on traffic studies.

Our firm is vary cost effective in conducting transportation studies. We are quick, efficient, and well organized due to the number of studies we do each year. The last NYSDOT audit set our overhead rate at about 72 percent compared to a typical overhead rate of over 115 percent for other firms. We use all of the latest capacity, signal timing and progression, and graphic computer programs. We own eight mechanical (tub type) traffic counters and four solid state counters for manual traffic counts. The cost for counter equipment would therefore be included in overhead and not rental rates. The solid state counters permits use to count intersections with only one person rather than the two that would be required using less sophisticated equipment. The reduction of all traffic count data is by computer.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

It is anticipated that the scope of work will follow the guidelines set forth in Attachment 'A' and Attachment 'B' of the Request for Proposals (RFP) received from the NFTC dated September 4, 1992. We expect that the established guidelines will be examined and modified under the direction of the Study Review Team as the project progresses. Particular emphases will be place on the areas of the Town described in the September 23, 1992 letter to the NFTC from Councilman Thomas Johnson. The scope of work and level of detail may vary based on time, budget constraints, and the nature of the traffic concerns identified by Tasks 1 through 6 of the RFP.

The general study procedures will follow the format outlined in the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) TOPICS Work Plan dated January 1972 and their latest guidelines for evaluating the impact of new development on the adjacent highway system. The need and recommendations for both short range and long range improvements will be determined and prioritized for implementation. Major improvements within traffic corridors and other long range improvements will be determined based on the long range planning effort of the NFTC and anticipated development within the Town of Cheektowaga and surrounding communities.

A considerable amount of data will be drawn for the existing files resulting from previous studies conducted by EMS Consulting within the western New York area.

A preliminary time schedule for the various project tasks is shown in the attached 'Study Schedule & Task Completion'. The schedule will be updated after the problem identification phase when the scope of work is expected to be better defined._

PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

It is anticipated that the project will be implemented similar to the previous TSM studies for the Town Cheektowaga and the Town of Tonawanda conducted by EMS Consulting. The method will be modified to account for existing conditions and to give more consideration to long range planning then was given in the previous TSM studies. In general, the original TSM study for the Town of Cheektowaga did not specifically include detailed analysis on the NYSDOT Highway System. It is our understanding that the State Highways will be included in this study along with any potential new highways identified by long range planning or anticipated new land developments.

It is expected that more emphases can be place on developing improvement packages since the data base is more extensive at this time and readily available form our files. Problem perceptions are also better defined at this time.

Every attempt would be made to fill any gaps is traffic volume data before snow prohibit mechanical traffic counts and the Holiday season influences manual traffic counts. We presently have eight mechanical counters and four electronic manual count devices. All counts will be computer reduced and tabulated.

High priority short range solutions to existing problem areas will be expedited to permit early identification of funding sources, programming, and implementation. The individual problem area reports will be in a format that can readily be converted to a Project Initiation Report.

PROJECT ORGANIZATION

Our only office is located in the city of Buffalo less than 1/2 mile from the Town of Cheektowaga. All work on the project will be accomplished with our staff at our office except for traffic count and inventory work accomplished by our DBE subcontractor. One of the subcontractors being considered is located two blocks from our office. Our close proximity to the study area and performing all work in-house will permit quick response time and better coordination. We will not have to rely on others for equipment, supplies, or any part of a work task except for our DBE Subconsultant.

All staff were born and raised in Western New York. They are familiar with the area and have personally experienced many of the transportation problem areas.

EMS Consulting pays for all hospital, medical, workmans compensation, and disability insurances without participation from the employees. There is no payroll deduction for a retirement plan.

Dear Mr. Miller:

Chester Bryan, Robert Buczynski and Sgt. Gary Schmidt met with me yesterday to review the consultant proposals received through the NFTC and to discuss priorities for study. As you know, we have been designated as members of the Study Review

Chester Bryan, our Town Engineer, will be presenting our Proposal Evaluations for each bidder and our joint recommendation on Thursday, September 23, at the scheduled Team meeting. Chet will also have solicited input from Jerome Gabryszak, Community and Economic Development Director, as well as from Town Supervisor Frank Swiatek.

Preliminarily our meeting on Tuesday generated the following priority list for broad focus areas:

- the effects of the recent opening of the William Street Thruway access ramps upon roads in Cheektowaga receiving additional traffic, and upon intersecting roads.
 - remedial measures, short and long range
- 2. the Walden (City Line to Dick Road) and Union (Kensington Expressway to West Seneca) intersecting State Highway corridors, impact of development since the '85 TSM Study and projected users.
 - remedial measures, short and long range
- 3. Transit Road from Walden (or George Urban) to Clinton Street (West Seneca). This stretch of north-south State Highway is perceived as overburdened and generating spill-over effects on Town and County roads. Rapid housing development east of Transit

Road is occurring and several large commercial projects are proposed along this highway requiring lane improvements.

- assessment of projected needs to expedite improvements and coordinate requirements for commercial development.
- 4. Town of Cheektowaga Truck Route Study/Plan to address resident impacts and transportation needs.
 - restrictions, routes, alternates
- 5. Cayuga/Dick Road County Highway from Cleveland Drive to Broadway, an alternate north-south corridor intersecting with Kensington Expressway and Genesee Street, as well as Walden and George Urban.
 - signal coordination, other
- 6. Harlem Road from Genesee Street through intersection with Kensington Expressway; Segment not scheduled for improvement under current project (from Greenleaf to north side of Genesee Street intersection).
- assess need for improvements and enhanced traffic exchange with Expressway

There are other specific identified needs (e.g., Cayuga Creek Road at William intersection signalization and signal coordination) and other connector roads to be directly addressed with updated data. However, we feel the foregoing relate to major system deficiencies within the Town and the need for defined responses from all jurisdictions. An itemized list is also being assembled for specific locations amenable to warrant study, from complaints filed with the Town and Traffic Safety Commission.

FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Contractor will comply with all of the following requirements:

- I. Title VI of the <u>Civil Rights Act of 1964</u> (42 U.S.C. 2000d <u>et seq.</u>), which provides that no person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color or national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.
- II. Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (the Act), as amended, which requires that no person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color, national origin or sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under, any program or activity funded in whole or in part with community development funds made available pursuant to the Act. Section 109 of the Act further provides that any prohibition against discrimination on the basis of age under the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.) or with respect to an otherwise handicapped person as provided in Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) shall also apply to any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available pursuant to the Act. The Contractor shall also cause compliance with Section 109 of the Act by all contractors and subcontractors providing labor or services to the Project.
- III. Section 3 of the <u>Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968</u> (12 U.S.C. 1701u), which requires that to the greatest extent feasible opportunities for training and employment be given to low and moderate income persons residing in the area in which the project is located, and that contracts for work in connection with the project be awarded to eligible business concerns which are located in, or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the same area as the Project. Regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development at 24 CFR Part 135 should be referred to as guidance indicative of the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development's view of the statutory objectives in other contexts.
- IV. Federal regulations at 24 CFR 570.609, which state that federal assistance shall not be used directly or indirectly to employ, award contracts to, or otherwise engage the services of, or fund any contractor or subrecipient during any period of debarment, suspension or placement in ineligibility status under the provisions of 24 CFR Part 24. If clearance is not obtained for the contractor from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, this Agreement shall be null and void.
- V. The Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and the implementing regulations at 24 CFR Part 570.

- VI. The Contractor will comply with and is bound by all federal requirements and regulations pertaining to copyrights and rights in data, and patent rights with respect to any discovery or invention which arises or is developed in the course of or under this contract.
- The Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Comptroller General of the United States and the Town of Cheektowaga, or any of their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to any books, documents, papers and records of the Contractor which are directly pertinent to this agreement for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts and transcriptions.
- VIII. The Contractor will retain all records pertaining to this agreement for a minimum period of three years after final payment for this agreement has been made and after all other pending matters in relationship to this agreement are closed.
 - IX. (1) To the best of the knowledge and belief of the parties to this Agreement, no Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the parties to this Agreement, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement.
 - (2) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the parties to this Agreement will complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
 - X. Remedies for Non-Compliance: If the Contractor fails to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement in a timely and proper manner or if the Contractor violates any of the covenants, agreements, conditions or stipulations of this Agreement, the Town shall thereupon have the right to impose one or any combination of the following remedies for non-compliance:
 (a) temporarily withholding cash payments pending correction of the deficiency;
 (b) disallow all or part of the cost of the activity or action which is not in compliance;
 (c) wholly or partially suspend or terminate the current award;
 (d) withhold further awards;
 or,
 (e) take other remedies which may be legally available.

Termination for Cause and for Convenience: the Town has the right to terminate this agreement for cause if the Contractor fails to fulfill or comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement by giving written notice to the Contractor at least fifteen (15) days before the effective date of such termination. The Town also has the right to terminate this agreement at any time by giving written notice to the Contractor and specifying the effective date of said termination. CONTRACT MODIFICATION AND EXTENSION

WHEREAS, the LICENSEE is desirous of renting the ice skating rink located in the Cheektowaga Recreation Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO;

1. PREMISES: The Town hereby grants a license to the LICENSEE to use the ice skating rink, including player and penalty boxes, and a dressing room designated by the Town, located in the Cheektowaga Recreation Center, on an exclusive basis, for each date and time that this license is in effect.

In addition, this license shall include the non-exclusive use of the lobby, vestibule and other public facilities, including parking areas, as any or all of the foregoing are appropriate to the particular use of the said Recreation Center as herein permitted.

2. RENT: The LICENSEE agrees to pay to the TOWN a total rental of \$3.450.00 which sum shall be paid as follows on or before:

December 1,	1992	\$ 3,450.00

In the event that any of the above mentioned rental payments are not made at the time specified for such payment, the TOWN shall have the right to cancel this license without notice to the LICENSEE.

- 3. USE OF PREMISES:
- a) The LICENSEE's use of the said Recreation Center is limited to hockey and ice skating only.
- b) The LICENSEE shall cause any spectators to sit in such areas as may be designated by the TOWN.
- c) The LICENSEE shall keep the areas used in good and clean condition, and shall not permit the accumulation of rubbish or debris on the premises.
- d) The LICENSEE shall return to premises, at the termination of this license, in the same condition as at the commencement of the term of this license, normal wear and tear expected; and shall be responsible for all damages which are caused by or through the acts or omissions of the LICENSEE, its agents, employees, and/or invitees.
- e) No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the premises.
- f) The LICENSEE shall comply with all laws, rules and regulations of any municipal authority, including police, fire, safety and health regulations and the reasonable requirements of the TOWN.
- g) The LICENSEE shall not assign, convey, transfer, sublet or otherwise dispose of this license to any other person, organization, firm or cooperation without first obtaining the written consent of the TOWN and/or the Recreation and Parks Committee of the Town of Cheektowaga.

In addition to the rent listed above, in the event the LICENSEE and/or its invitees do not vacate the PREMISES by 10:50 p.m. on the day of the rental, LICENSEE shall reimburse the TOWN for the following expenses within fourteen (14) days of demand thereof by the TOWN;

- a) Personnel costs (i.e. overtime or additional salaries paid) for TOWN employees who remained on the PREMISES.
- b) Additional rent at the rental rate of \$100 per hour for the additional time LICENSEE and/or its invitees remained on the PREMISES.

- 4. UTILITIES AND ICE CLEANING SERVICES: The TOWN shall provide all water, heat, as, oil and electrical current for the usage of the LICENSEE in the areas assigned herein. In addition, the TOWN shall provide for the cleaning of the ice facilities and the rink and for snow removal in the parking areas; however, the TOWN shall not be liable for any interruption or delay in any of the above mentioned services.
 - a. The LICENSEE shall be responsible for on-PREMISES crowd control while it is renting the PREMISES.
- INSURANCE: The LICENSEE shall procure and pay for General Liability insurance in the amounts of \$500,000 5. each occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate for bodily injury and property damage combined with such insurance to cover participants for any activities performed on The TOWN, its agents and employees shall TOWN premises. be named as additional insureds under such policy or policies, and such insurance shall be primary to any other insurance protecting the TOWN. The LICENSEE shall provide the Town with a Certificate of the Insurance which states the TOWN shall be given at least thirty (30) days advance written notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change of the insurance required of the LICENSEE. In the event of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change of such insurance, the TOWN shall have the writ to cancel this license.
- 6. NON-LIABILITY OF OWNER: This license is made upon the express condition that the TOWN shall be free from all liabilities in claims for damages and/or lawsuits for or by reason of any injury or injuries to any person or property of any kind whatsoever, from any cause or causes whatsoever while in or upon said premises during the term of this license or occasioned by any occupancy or use of said premises or any activity carried on by LICENSEE in connection herewith, and LICENSEE hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the TOWN from all liabilities, charges, claims, expenses (including attorney fees) and costs on account of or by reason of such injuries, liabilities, claims, lawsuits or losses however occurring and damages arising from the same.

7. FORCE MAJEURE: In the event of total or partial destruction of the Recreation Center by fire or other peril, or by any act of nature, during the term of this license or subsequent to its execution, the TOWN shall have the option of terminating this license by giving the LICENSEE written notice to that effect or by repairing the premises with due diligence and continuing this license in effect. Should the TOWN decide to repair the damage with due diligence, the rent for the period required for such repair shall be equitably reduced in proportion to the reduction, if any, in usable space of the premises.

Other peril, as above mentioned, shall be interpreted to include power failure, compressor failure and Zamboni failure.

In addition, no claim shall be made by the LICENSEE against the TOWN based upon any shutdown of the Recreation Center caused by inclement weather, faulty construction of equipment, or for any other reason whatsoever other than the gross negligence of the TOWN.

8. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS: This license agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and there are no understandings, agreements or representations, expressed or implied, not specified herein respecting this license.

The rights of the parties hereto shall be deemed cumulative and not alternative. Waiver of strict compliance or performance of any term or condition hereto shall not be deemed a waiver of any other provisions of this license and nay waiver of any breach of any term or condition hereof shall not be deemed to extend to any other breach or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, condition or provision.

LIGHTING AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

- 1. In consideration of the Agreement hereinafter contained by the Town to take from National Fuel and pay National Fuel for services herein described, National Fuel agrees to supply gas for the gas lighting system in the Town being: ALL PROPERTY as set forth in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter referred to as the "Gas Lighting District"). The standards and lamps listed in Exhibit A are the property of the Town and are located approximately as shown on the maps attached as Exhibits B-AJ. The connections from the standards and lamps to the gas lines of National Fuel are and shall remain the property of National Fuel.
- 2. The Town agrees to maintain a gas lighting system in the Gas Lighting District during the term hereof and to take gas for the gas lighting system from National Fuel and to pay National Fuel each year: (A) For fuel for such lighting units at National Fuel's

then current tariff rate. Said gas usage, 21.6 Mcf per year for single or double mantle and 33.6 Mcf per year triple mantle, shall be billed by National Fuel and paid by the Town on a monthly basis under SC-3 General rate class excluding minimum billing; (B) For maintenance (maintenance shall entail four (4) cleanings within a twelve (12) month period), the amount of \$62.00 annually for each installed gas lighting unit. These charges shall be billed by National Fuel and paid by the Town on a monthly basis. This maintenance charge may be increased by National Fuel upon sixty (60) days prior notice to the Town; (C) For the connection of gas to each additional gas light standard, the sum of \$163.00 per each connection. These charges shall be billed by National Fuel and paid by the Town upon receipt of invoice.

- 3. The term of this Agreement shall be for ten years.
- 4. National Fuel's maintenance service as described above shall be for normal wear and tear to maintain the gas lights in proper working order.

In the event of damage to a light and/or post not resulting from normal wear and tear, National Fuel shall replace such parts of the light and/or post as are damaged and the Town shall pay National Fuel the expense incurred for such replacement, including parts and labor, within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice. In the event of damage to or destruction of a light and post which requires total replacement, National Fuel shall replace the entire installation and the Town shall pay National Fuel the cost of the

light from the manufacturer and freight plus ten percent (10%), and labor for each such replacement within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice.

- 5. Upon the written request of the Town Board and the consent of the owner or owners of the equipment affected, National Fuel shall change the location of installed standards and lamps and the Town shall pay to National Fuel the amount of actual costs, including labor, incurred by National Fuel in making such changes, which payment shall be in addition to the payments elsewhere provided for herein and shall be made within ten (10) days after the invoice is rendered.
- 6. All maintenance shall be performed during the normal working hours within a reasonable time after notice is received of such defect, interruption or malfunction of the lighting system. National Fuel reserves the right to subcontract at anytime the maintenance work described in this Agreement.
- 7. Lighting service shall be provided at the minimum from dusk to dawn each night during the term of this Agreement, and may, at the option of National Fuel, be provided for longer periods or continuously.
- 8. National Fuel shall endeavor to provide an uninterrupted gas supply, but in case such supply shall be interrupted for the purpose of making changes or repairs to National Fuel's transmission or distribution system, or shall fail in whole or in part by reason of a line separation, fire, flood, labor dispute, accident or Act of

God or governmental authority or any other cause beyond its control, National Fuel shall not be in default under this Agreement and shall not be liable for any damages resulting therefrom, but National Fuel shall be bound in good faith to restore service as soon as is reasonably practicable.

- 9. In furnishing service under this Agreement, National Fuel shall not be required to extend its lines or place its equipment in, upon, under or across lands or improvements which are not in public ways under the jurisdiction and control of the Town unless the Town first procures and delivers to National Fuel good and sufficient rights, easements and permits therefore from all necessary parties or directs National Fuel in writing to procure the same. In the latter case, the Town shall reimburse National Fuel for the amount of actual cost and expense, including attorney's fees, incurred in procuring such rights, easements and permits.
- 10. The Town shall not exercise or authorize or permit the exercise of rights in its streets, roads, lanes and/or highways which will or may interfere with, impede or injure facilities or structures of National Fuel required in connection with furnishing service hereunder except upon reasonable notice to National Fuel. If the exercise of any such rights requires the removal, relocation, replacement or protection of any of National Fuel's facilities or structures, work in connection therewith shall be done by or under the direction of National Fuel at the sole cost and expense of the person or organization exercising such rights.

- 11. Tree trimming necessary for light distribution on the streets, roads, lanes, highways or sidewalks therealong is a responsibility of the Town and shall be done by the Town or by special arrangement at the expense of the Town.
- 12. Upon the termination of this Agreement, and all renewals and extensions thereof, National Fuel shall have the right within a reasonable time thereafter to take up and remove its transmission and distribution lines and any other equipment belonging to National Fuel installed or used under or in pursuance or performance of this Agreement, but shall not be required to do so. Upon such removal, National Fuel shall leave the public ways and places affected thereby in the same or as good condition as they were immediately prior thereto.
- 13. All previous agreements, if any, between the parties or their predecessors covering all or a portion of the lighting service provided for in this Agreement shall terminate or be terminated as of the effective date of this Agreement, except that the obligation of the Town (and any lighting district of the Town) to pay for services or light fixtures theretofore rendered under any such prior agreements shall survive.
- 14. It is agreed by the parties hereto that the applicable provisions of 103-a of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York are incorporated herein and shall apply hereto.

of December, 1991, by and between the Town of Cheektowaga, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, having its principal place of business at Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York 14227 (hereinafter the "Town"); and the Cheektowaga Historical Association, a not-for-profit corporation organized and existing under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York, with its principal place of business at 3329 Broadway, Cheektowaga, New York 14227 (hereinafter "Association").

WITNESSETH

. WHEREAS, the Town is the owner of the Cheektowaga Historical Museum, located at 3329 Broadway in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York (hereinafter "Museum"); and

WHEREAS, the Association is desirous of using and operating the Museum for the preservation and protection of works of art and other objects having special historical or aesthetic interest or value, and for the viewing of same by the public, and

WHEREAS, the Town is desirous of assisting the Association in the operation of the Museum, and

WHEREAS, an agreement by and between the Town and the Association for the purpose of using and operating the Cheektowaga Historical Museum is authorized by Section 57.13 of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law of the State of New York;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby

acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Town hereby agrees to grant the Association, subject to the conditions contained herein, the right to use and operate the Museum, free-of-charge and without the payment of rental therefor, for the purpose of preserving and protecting works of art and other objects having special historical or aesthetic interest or value. For such purpose, the Association is allowed to use and occupy the Museum for the purpose of storing therein historical artifacts owned by or leased to the Town or Association.
 - 2. The Association hereby agrees to operate the Museum:
 - a) for the benefit of the public; and
- b) for the preservation and protection of works of art and other objects having special historical or aesthetic interest or value.

The Association also agrees to keep the Museum open to the public each Sunday from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. and during such other times as so arranged by the Association.

The Association hereby agrees that it will not use the Museum for any purpose other than listed herein.

3. The Association agrees to designate a site manager, who will be responsible for the general operation of the Museum and, in addition thereto, the Association will secure the services of a sufficient number of volunteers in order to effectively use and operate the Museum. The Association will notify the Town Attorney's Office and Facilities Department Director, in writing, as to who is designated as the site manager and who is in possession of the keys to the Museum. Only the site manager and one alternate may possess keys.

- 4. The Association agrees to perform minor maintenance and housekeeping in the interior of the Museum. The Association hereby agrees to take special care that no damage happens to the Museum or any fixtures therein.
- 5. The Town hereby agrees to maintain the lawn and shrubbery surrounding the Museum and to perform major maintenance work, including painting, on the interior and exterior of the Museum. The Association will submit to the Town Facilities Department Director a written request no later than July 1st annually, specifying major maintenance and/or improvements it wishes performed in the following fiscal year (January 1 December 31). Major maintenance and improvements are subject to funding of same by the Cheektowaga Town Board.
- 6. The Association agrees that the Town shall not be liable for any damage or loss to the contents of the Museum.
- 7. The Town hereby agrees to pay the following bills/charges on the Museum:
 - a. Property taxes
 - b. Water bills
 - c. Gas bills
 - d. Electric bills
 - e. Sewer charges
- 8. The Association may not assign its rights under this agreement to anyone else.
- 9. The Town reserves the right to enter the Museum at any time as it deems fit.

10. This agreement shall be effective for a term beginning on the 1st day of January, 1992 and terminating on December 31, 1996.

1.) ARTICLE 2 should be amended as follows:

Town proposal to change titles is accepted. Change "Dog Warden" to "Animal Control Officer."

2.) ARTICLE 3, Section 3.01 shall be modified by adding a new subsection (c) to read as follows:

3.) ARTICLE 3, Section 3.03 shall be modified in part as follows:

Delete "Youth Bureau" Add "Recycling, Sign Maintenance and Youth and Recreation"

This payment can be made only when the employee

signs a statement that the employee has or will procure health insurance through the spouse's employment, other employment of the employee, or a private insurance plan. If the employee wishes to rejoin the plan within the year, the employee must repay the prorata portion of the payment (Example: 6 months, \$300.00 - Individual and \$600.00 Dependent) and show a change in circumstances regarding the alternative health plan (non-voluntary loss of coverage). Payment under this Section shall be made within thirty (30) days of the effective day of dropping the Town's plan.

Employees who exercise their option under this Section shall remain eligible for Section 14(e) benefits at time of retirement. Employees who quit prior to the end of the year shall repay the prorata portion of such payment."
