Be advised that the Town Highway Superintendent has determined that the sidewalk in front of property owned by you is in need of repair/replacement. Based on his determination and in accordance with State law, the Cheektowaga Town Board adopted a resolution/order on July 5, 1994 directing the repair/replacement of your sidewalk and further directing this office to send you this letter and the attached Notice.

With respect to the repair/replacement of your sidewalk, you have the following two options:

- You can choose to repair/replace your sidewalk at 100% expense to you (the Town will not reimburse for any part of the expense if you do the work yourself). If you choose this option, you must notify the Town Highway Department at 686-3450 and complete the work on or before August 5, 1994.
- 2. You can allow the Town (or its contractor) to perform the work. If the Town performs the work, you will be responsible for paying 50% of the Town's cost for such work. Based on the latest construction bid costs, you will be charged approximately \$25 per 20-square-foot block of sidewalk to be repaired/replaced. The Town Highway Department will schedule the work to be done and will estimate the work required by placing markings on your sidewalk. After the work is completed, the Town Highway Department will notify you of the actual charge to you for the work and give you the following two payment options:
 - A. Pay 100% to the Town on or before September 15, 1994; OR
 - B. Have the charges placed on your 1995 and 1996 County/Town tax bills (includes a 6% interest charge).

If you have any questions concerning the repair/replacement of your sidewalk, please direct them to the Town Highway Department at 686-3450.



Members of the Committee:

NYNEX Mobile Communications has met with the Cheektowaga Conservation Advisory Committee (CCAC) for review of the proposed project. The CCAC has made several comments and suggestions which I would like to address at this time.

- 1. The CCAC requested that coniferous trees be planted between the Hilltop Day Care Center and the proposed tower. These trees would provide screening during the winter, when the existing trees have lost their leaves. As the updated site plan indicates, we have agreed to plant 8 trees in the area specified by the CCAC. Also the Planning board also requested that additional trees be planted between the Buffalo Crushed Stone property and Como Park Blvd. These ten trees are also indicated on the revised site plan.
- 2. The CCAC requested that NYNEX Mobile Communications attempt to obtain a written guarantee from Buffalo Crushed Stone stating that the existing trees, in a radius around the proposed tower would be preserved. This radius would be equal to the distance from the proposed tower to Como Park Blvd., will be preserved. Attached you will find a copy of a letter that was sent to Mr. Jamie Hypnarowski of Buffalo Crushed Stone. Buffalo Crushed Stone has verbally indicated that while they would most likely always maintain a buffer of trees, never-the-less, for various reasons, they have declined to commit themselves to not removing trees.
- 3. NYNEX was also asked to consult the Town's wetlands map, prepared by Earth Dimensions, Inc. which is available for inspection at the Building Department. We have contacted Earth Dimensions, Inc. to assist us in this request. Earth Dimensions, Inc. has prepared a report on this issue, which I have included with this letter.

4. The CCAC also requested that we contact the operators of the Hilltop Day Care Center to explain our project to them and address their concerns, if any. On 6/15/94 Greiner, of Nixon, Mr. Thomas C. Hargrave, Devans and Doyle, Attorneys representing NYNEX Mobile Communications and Dr. Thomas S. Ely, M.D. and myself met with Ms. Fran Nabozny and Ms. Linda Gorczynski, operators of the Hilltop Day Care Center. The only stipulation being that we are made aware of any intended antenna loads prior to engineering and construction of the tower. This is necessary so that we will be able to build into the tower enough load carrying capacity to handle any present or future loads.

UNDERTAKING IN CONNECTION WITH PERMITS ISSUED BY THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the undersigned Town of Cheektowaga from time to time receives permits from the Department of Transportation of the State of New York (hereinafter referred to as the "Department") allowing the Town of Cheektowaga to temporarily obstruct, install, construct, maintain, operate or replace any facilities within the bounds of a State highway right-of-way pursuant to Sections 52, 103, 203, 249 and/or 250 of the Highway Law; and

WHEREAS, the Department requires that the municipality file an undertaking to secure the Town of Cheektowaga's faithful performance within the terms of any such permit and also to indemnify the State of New York (hereinafter referred to as the "State") and others with respect to all operations under such permits by the Town of Cheektowaga.

NOW THEREFORE, the Town of Cheektowaga hereby undertakes, to and with the State and the Department, that:

- 1. The Town of Cheektowaga will well, truly and faithfully comply with and perform all the terms and conditions of each such permit on its part to be kept and performed, and abide by and comply with all such conditions, rules and regulations as may be, from time to time, promulgated by the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of New York (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner"), according to the true intent and meaning of such permits, rules and regulations;
- 2. The Town of Cheektowaga will, at its own expense, promptly complete the work allowed under each permit and within a reasonable time restore State property damaged by its work to substantially the same or equivalent condition as existed before such work was begun;

and in the event that the Town of Cheektowaga fails to so restore damaged State property within what the Commissioner deems to be a reasonable time, the Commissioner, after giving written notice to the Municipality, may restore the property to substantially the same or equivalent condition as existed before the Municipality began the work and require the municipality to reimburse the State for any and all costs incurred by the State in such restoration.

- 3. The Town of Cheektowaga which is self-insured, will pay any and all damages, costs, including but not limited to attorney's fees, and judgments recovered against the State, the Commissioner of Transportation, the Department of Transportation and their officials, officers, and employees in connection with work allowed by a permit or from use of a permit by the Town of Cheektowaga of by any person acting by, through or for the Town of Cheektowaga, including omissions and supervisory acts of any entities or persons named above.
- 5. It is understood that this undertaking is one of indemnity only and is not to be construed as imposing on the Town of Cheektowaga an obligation to pay claims for which there would not otherwise be a remedy in law against the State of New York.

6. Any payments required by the foregoing will be guaranteed by the full faith and
credit of the Town of Cheektowaga, or its districts, as applicable, and will be paid out of current
budgeted funds, or if insufficient, from its liability and casualty reserve fund or from the
proceeds of bonds which current laws permit the Town of Cheektowaga to issue to pay claims
against it.

The applicant submitted a new plan showing that the buildings will be reversed with traffic to be accessed from both Union Road and Old Union Road as approved by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT).

Proposed construction of a detached garage

The Engineering Department has received and reviewed a Development Permit Application submitted by the owner of the subject property, Mr. Leigh Sworts who proposes to construct an 18' x 32' detached garage as depicted on the enclosed property survey. Mr. Sworts was referred to this office by the Building & Plumbing Inspections Office as the subject property is located within the special flood hazard area for Slate Bottom Creek as depicted on current FEMA mapping. This property, as well as adjoining parcels, are currently improved with residential structures built an estimated 25+ years ago, prior to the existence of floodplain regulations. The existing dwellings do not meet today's standards which would result in their inundation with floodwaters during a 100 year storm event, based on a review of available topographic data.

The Town Flood Damage Local Law requires the first floor of any building to be elevated above the base flood elevation which, based on a surveyors' recent determination, is some 2.5' above existing grade at this location. The definition of "building" as defined in Section 2.0 of the subject ordinance is as follows:

"Any structure built for support, shelter or enclosure for occupancy or storage."

This definition, in my opinion, requires that the construction of a garage comply with the subject ordinance.

Having made a site inspection and based on a review of existing developed properties which abut this site, and the existing topography, I am in support of the variance request of Mr. Sworts, outlined in his June 24, 1994 communication to this office (copy attached). The variance provisions of the Flood Damage Prevention Local Law under Section 6.0 designates that the Town Board shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the requirements of this local law and enables the Town Board to attach any conditions it deems appropriate. This department, in reviewing the available technical data and the considerations of Section 6.1(4) of the ordinance, would have no objection to the granting of a variance provided the following conditions are complied with:

- (1) The garage structure shall be anchored to a suitable concrete floor slab to resist flotation, collapse or lateral movement.
- (2) The structure shall be constructed with materials resistant to flood damage.
- (3) Any utilities, ie: electrical or other service facilities, shall be installed and/or located to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding.
- (4) The construction of the driveway and the finish grades established around the completed structure, together with the discharge of roof waters shall be accomplished in a manner where stormwaters are not directed to neighboring property.
- Upon granting of this variance, the applicant is hereby given notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with the floor elevation two (2') feet below the Base Flood Elevation and that the cost of flood insurance, if required, will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.
- (6) Applicant shall comply with Section 4.3-3 of the Town Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance pertaining to submission of as-built floor elevations upon completion.

I met with you on June 2, 1994, and discussed the required distance my future detached garage needed to be from Slate Creek. At that time you stated that I needed to follow a procedure to ensure I built that garage at a certain first floor elevation.

In compliance with that procedure, I hired a surveyor and learned that the stipulated elevation is approximately 2.5 feet above the ground at the highest point. At this time I would like to apply for a variance seeking relief from building at that elevation. I have listed the reasons for this application below:

My lot is only 50' wide - filling & grading would be very expensive and impractical due to water run off onto my neighbor's property.

Constructing concrete ramps at the entrances of the garage would be hazardous to driving and children playing in the driveway.

The added expense for additional concrete and labor would take the garage outside of my budget.

My house is not at the proposed elevation and putting a garage above the house would cause drainage problems.



3788 Broadway

Proposed Office/Storage Building

Applicant:

J.J. Juliano

The applicant at the present time has a building on the site that houses offices and the Juliano Construction Company. They are proposing to construct a 144'x 50' building to the east of their existing structure. This building would be of similar construction with a brick front, two story office portion with the balance concrete block walls. At the present time they are talking to numerous parties regarding the rental of the building and have no definite tenants at this time.

The proposed building and its use would be compatible with existing uses in the area. This stretch of Broadway is a mix of residential and light manufacturing uses including a number of contractors' storage yards. To the east of the property is an appraisal office and to the west an ambulance company with ambulance storage facilities. Only a small portion of the rear will be developed for additional parking of 16 cars. The Town Engineer indicated that he would need drainage calculations to determine the adequacy of a proposed retention area at Broadway.

A letter had been received from the owner of the ambulance company to the west requesting a fence from Ellicott Road to the back of the existing building. After much discussion it was determined that the 700± lineal feet of fence is not necessary since the storage area at the rear of the existing building is a legal non-conforming use and this faces the ambulance parking lot. The Zoning Law does not require fencing in such a situation.

Public comment is open until August 8, 1994 and therefore this item will remain tabled for public comment as well as comments from the various Town groups.



The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Advisory Committee at a meeting held on July 27, 1994 in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM I

1845 Dale Road

Proposed 100' Cellular Telephone Tower

Applicant:

Buffalo Telephone

The Planning Board has reviewed the proposal and has recommended approval since this tower and its building are not readily visible from public roads.

As previously discussed in the July the minutes, the tower is designed to fill in a "dead spot" within the cellular telephone coverage. The location of the tower is at the rear of Cook Movers and is not visible from Walden Avenue or readily visible from Broadway. The tower, 100' high, would blend in with the numerous power line towers that parallel the New York State Thruway.

Since no further comment was received since the July meeting the Environmental Advisory Committee is recommending the Town Board issue a Negative Declaration for this project.

The applicant is proposing to construct a 100' self supporting tower at the rear of the existing Cook Movers building located at 1845 Dale Road. Along with tower will be constructed a 12'x24' equipment building.

The property is located at the end of Dale Road along a paper street called Ray Road. Directly to the north across Dale is FS&G Industries and to the east a power company right-of-way on which exists the main transmission lines for both Niagara Mohawk and New York State Electric and Gas running north and south along with 2 Niagara Mohawk power substations. To the south of the site is located the eastern terminus of the Conrail Frontier Yard with rail lines running east. To the west is Clark Lift.

The company has located their tower in this area to fill in a" dead spot" within their cellular telephone coverage. This dead spot was not covered by the tower at French and Union Roads.

The tower will not intrude upon any residential areas since the entire area surrounding Cook Movers is zoned and used industrially. Furthermore, the tower will not "standout" since there exists numerous large towers for the primary power lines running north and south directly to the east of the site.

Landscaping was discussed and deemed not practical since there is no where to place landscaping for screening and any work along the rail line may result in disturbance of fill and other unknown materials.

This item will remain tabled for the close of public comment on July 25, 1994.

The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Advisory Committee at a meeting held on August 10, 1994 in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM

25 Tyrol Drive

Proposed 8,000 Sq. Ft. Office/ Warehouse

Applicant:

Victor Liberatore

The applicant is proposing to construct this office/ warehouse on the site within the Gardenville Industrial Park North. Tyrol Drive is a private road which extends south from Innsbruck. The lot fronting on Tyrol is a through-lot with frontage on Union Road. All access to the lot is from Tyrol Drive since Union Road at this point is sloped to meet the bridge near French Road.

The business that will be the primary tenant is Liberator Clock. They sell and service time clocks as well as other time pieces with industrial applications. The building will face south with parking proposed for the east, west and south sides of the building.

After some discussion the owner has agreed to eliminate parking along the west side of the building to allow for additional green area along Union Road. He will continue to maintain a service entrance which will necessitate the keeping of a 10 to 15 foot wide driveway.

He has agreed to save as many existing trees as possible and will be meeting with members of the CCAC to discuss his plans.

WHEREAS, the Applicant has made revisions to the project plans; has committed to constructing road improvements to Union Road; has committed to providing certain controls during construction and after completion, as listed on the attached letters from the Applicant, and

WHEREAS, the EAC, after a careful review of the foregoing material and in consultation with the other Departments of the Town, has recommended to the Town Board that the Town Board issue a "Negative Declaration", as stated in the attached memorandum, dated August 12, 1994, and

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The Planning Board will be reviewing the landscaping plan at their August 11th meeting and based on discussions, with the Town Engineer with regard to drainage and the Planning Board on landscaping, the applicant will be presenting a new site plan for the committee's August 24th meeting, therefore, this item will remain tabled.

ITEM VI

Union Consumer Square

Phase II Construction of Approximately 160,000 Square Feet of Retail Space

Applicant:

Benderson Development Corporation/Holiday Union Associates II

The proposal was first filed with the Town in March of 1994. The proposal was to demolish the Holiday Theaters located at 3755 Union Road and to construct approximately 160,000 square feet of retail space. 40,000 square feet of retail space would be located in the area generally occupied by the Holiday I and II Theaters with the balance located along the east line of the property as a continuation of the existing Union Consumer Square. The proposals at the present time are for retail sales use. No restaurants, which could be competition for the existing Garcia's and Holiday Showcase, are contemplated for the Phase II portion of the Square.

As part of the review process, this project was referred to the New York State Department of Transportation for their review and comment as well as to numerous Town Committees/Boards. As a result the developer has attended numerous meetings involving the Town Traffic Safety Commission, Planning Board, Environmental Advisory Committee, Conservation Advisory Council and the New York State Department of Transportation. At these meetings a number of concerns and questions were put to the developer. These included questions on traffic, drainage, hours of operation, control of delivery vehicles, on-premises housekeeping as well as other items. They were addressed as follows:

O Traffic - The NYSDOT reviewed the traffic study that was performed for the project by EMS Consulting (it should be noted that this study included Galleria Corners data as if the corner was already develop). They concluded that additional data was needed and the Town, in addition to requiring the additional data for the NYSDOT, requested the developer to obtain a second traffic consultants opinion.

As a result a traffic study with additional data was submitted to the NYSDOT for their review and to SRF and Associates of Rochester, New York, the second consultant.

The traffic study indicated that there would some minor impact to the traffic on Union Road and that certain mitigation measures could be taken to alleviate the problems encountered with levels of service in the area. These measures would be construction of a center left turn lane on Union Road from Galleria Drive south pass South Creek or construction of a bridge across Scajaquada Creek Drive connecting to South Creek Drive.

Date: August 11, 1994

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In addition to the bridge, the possibility of installing a traffic signal at Union and South Creek was explored. The second consultant, SRF and Associates, reviewed the study and concluded that the impact upon Union Road was minor and did not warrant the construction of the bridge across South Creek but that minor road improvements to Union Road may be needed to improve traffic flows in this area.

The NYSDOT in reviewing the traffic study and possible mitigation for the proposed project had to eliminate any possible mitigation in the way of road improvements to Union Road. This was the result of an agreement signed in 1992 between the Town and the developer which had said that the developer would place in escrow, for future road improvements, the balance of monies from road improvements that were constructed in '92 - '93. This amount of money, approximately \$72,000, was to be used by the state for future road improvements. As a result any future work at Union Consumer Square would not require the developer to provide mitigation on Union Road. The NYDOT did indicate that the bridge across South Creek may be a feasible alternative to other mitigation. The NYSDOT also indicated many improvements would be part of a 1998 DOT project on Union Road.

Since the NYSDOT's comments could not consider road improvements to Union Road, numerous discussions were held between the developer and the Town. The developer has agreed to spend approximately \$200,000 in interim improvements if the '92 agreement is terminated.

The Environmental Advisory Committee believes it is best for the Town to terminate the agreement and encourage the NYSDOT to approve the interim road improvements to Union Road.

- O The developer has submitted to the Town a copy of special regulations for tenants on the property. These include control of delivery vehicles, dumpsters, rodent controls, noise producing equipment as well as other typical housekeeping items.
- O The developer has also agreed to dust control, rodent control and other measures during the construction of the facilities.
- O Drainage The developers intent is to utilize most of the existing drainage system within this portion of the Square and the Town Engineer is in the process of reviewing these details. It does not appear that a significant amount of piping or other site work will be required to drain the proposed facilities. The project will also not involve any significant increase in impervious surfaces since most of the site is now blacktop and building.

Since the developer has committed to providing mitigation for this project, it is the recommendation of this committee that the Town Board issue a Negative Declaration for the project.

As a result of recent meetings with Town officials and neighboring residents to the above referenced property, this letter shall serve as a site management agreement between the managing company, Benderson Development Company, Inc. UNION CONSUMER SQUARE 3755 UNION ROAD CHEEKTOWAGA, NY SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE PROPERTY OWNER AND TENANTS

In conformance with local ordinances and requests by neighboring residents and Town officials, the following rules must be adhered to:

- The local noise ordinance is in effect from 11pm to 7am. Any noise producing activity or operation is prohibited between these hours. This includes, but is not limited to, dumpster and compactor deliveries, servicing and use; any delivery producing noise i.e. engine idling, dock activities; snowplowing operations and parking lot sweeping operations.
- 2. The delivery gates leading to the rear of the plaza will be locked when the noise ordinance is in effect. Delivery trucks are not allowed to stack or keep their engines running at the eastern most gate near the residential properties.
- 3. All delivery drivers must observe and obey NYS DEC regulations regarding vehicle exhaust as related to engine idling. Signs have been posted strategically as a reminder.
- 4. All dumpsters must be secured at all times by keeping lids closed and padlocked to prevent unauthorized dumpings and rodent infestation. Areas around the dumpsters must be kept clean by the tenant.
- 5. Tenants must practice pest and rodent control around the dumpster/compactor area by contracting with a certified pest control company to install and service (monthly) bait containers.
- 6. Bait containers must be placed along the fence at the eastern property line and serviced (monthly) by a certified pest control company at the direction of the property owner. Said costs shall be included in the common area maintenance charges.
- 7. Any tenant requiring refrigerated products to be delivered must have an exterior outlet near the delivery area in order to allow the delivery person to connect to the outlet to maintain product and shut off the engine.
- 8. Any tenant utilizing exterior motor driven equipment, i.e. HVAC units, generators, must use the equipment with the latest technology in that product line related to noise reduction and abatement.
- 9. It is the responsibility of the property owner and tenants to notify their respective vendors.

Pursuant to the request of Councilman Thomas Johnson, I wish to reaffirm the commitment by Holiday/Union Associates to construct temporary improvements along Union Road in advance of the New York State Department of Transportation project scheduled for 1998, as our contribution to mitigating existing traffic congestion and to provide relief to the intersection of Union Road and South Creek Drive, with consideration for the safety of the pedestrian and vehicular traffic using the Union Road arterial.

We further agree to undertake the process of engineering and approval by the New York State Department of Transportation upon formal approval by the Town Board for the expansion of Union Consumer Square. We believe this process can be accomplished by mid to late November 1994, which will afford us the opportunity to solicit bids and award contracts through the winter months and be prepared to commence construction in the early Spring of 1995. 

Since the inception of the subject project and throughout the approval process with the Town of Cheektowaga, Holiday-Union Associates has met with representatives from the Town Engineering Department, Building Department, Town Board, Planning Board, Traffic Safety Commission, Environmental Committee, Conservation Advisory Committee, neighborhood committees and the New York State Department of Transportation to discuss the proposed expansion of Union Consumer Square. In addition, H.U.A. retained the services of two professional Traffic Engineers at the Town's request.

As a result of this input and in an effort to improve the existing vehicular safety and to provide additional traffic movement relief at the intersection of Union Road and South Creek Drive, H.U.A. has committed to the following mitigation measures as delineated in EMS Consulting's letter of August 8, 1994 (copy attached) and EMS Consulting's letter of August 5, 1994 to the New York State Department of Transportation (copy attached):

- Widen Union Road from McKesson Parkway, north to the existing M & T Bank driveway, including required transitioning to the existing Cheektowaga School driveway.
- Reconfigure the existing traffic lanes, resulting in the creation of a center "fifth" lane for the left-turning traffic, in addition to the two southbound and northbound lanes.
- Modify existing pavement markings and traffic signage.
- Provide an additional left turn lane from the existing plaza southbound onto Union Road.

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As a condition to these mitigation measures, H.U.A. requests termination of the September 12, 1992 agreement between the town of Cheektowaga, Holiday Union Associates and the New York State Department of Transportation regarding the Phase III Improvements to Union Road and to apply the remaining funds (\$71,999.77), to the mitigation measures.

In closing, it should be noted that the mitigation measures aforementioned are to be considered interim improvements, providing a transition to the 1998 New York State Department of Transportation project on Union Road. The '98 Project will be designed to alleviate the existing traffic congestion problems on Union Road, created by normal traffic growth and numerous local developments.

The following is in response to your comments to Thomas Adamczak dated July 7, 1994 on the subject Traffic Impact study report.

General

Your letter outlined the September 18, 1992 agreement between the Town of Cheektowaga, the Holiday-Union Associates, and the NYSDOT regarding Phase III improvements to Union Road. The letter also stated that the NYSDOT will cooperate in reviewing any proposed interim improvements to Union Road if the Town and Holiday-Union Associates agree to terminate the agreement.

A meeting was held between Councilman Tom Johnson and the Holiday-Union Associates on July 19, 1994. Councilman Johnson and Mr. Randall Benderson, representing Holiday-Union Associates, agreed to terminate the agreement and apply the funds remaining from Phase I & Phase II of the project (\$71,999.77) to interim improvements on Union Road. The interim improvements would provide a transition to the 1998 project on Union Road scheduled by the NYSDOT. The interim project would add to the vehicular safety as well as provide additional traffic movement relief at the intersection of Union Road and South Creek Drive. The 1998 NYSDOT project will be designed to alleviate the existing traffic congestion problems created by normal traffic growth and the numerous development in the area.

A meeting was held between EMS Consulting and NYSDOT Traffic and Safety Division staff on July 5, 1994 to discuss design standards if Union Road were widened to 5 lanes at this time as an interim improvement. The standards required for Phase III in 1992 were for what was considered to be permanent improvements since a NYSDOT project was not programmed at the time. Now that a project is scheduled for 1998, it was indicated that the standards can be relaxed somewhat. The following would be the minimum improvements:

- 1. The curb line would have to be moved back about two feet on the west side of Union Road from McKesson Parkway north to the Bank Driveway as previously included in Project Phase III.
- 2. Provisions for pedestrian traffic would only be required on the east side of Union Road. The width of the bridge over Scajaquada Creek is approximately 68.3 feet between curbs. The road lane configuration would therefore be the following from west to east on the bridge.

A 14 foot outside southbound through traffic lane adjacent to the existing west curb line, a 11 foot through traffic lane southbound, a 10 foot center lane for left turning traffic, a 11 foot northbound through traffic lane, and a 12 foot northbound through traffic lane.

This lane configuration would retain the existing 10 foot shoulder area for pedestrian traffic on the east side of the bridge.

- 3. The existing bridge railing would remain. Extra wide 20 inch thrie beam corrugated guide rail would be installed across the bridge on the west side to reinforce the existing bridge rail.
- 4. The lane configuration on the bridge described in item 2 above would be continued south to the Dick's Plaza driveway and Cheektowaga School driveway intersection. Concrete curb would be installed on the west side from the bridge curb south to the School driveway. No sidewalk would be required on the west side of Union Road off the bridge. Corrugated beam guide rail would be required about 1 foot behind the curb both north of the bridge to McKesson Parkway and south of the bridge to the School driveway. A closed drainage system would be provided on the west side as included in Project Phase III.
- 5. The pavement widening would be transitioned and an the 8 foot shoulder constructed south of Cheektowaga School driveway on the west side of Union Road in about 450 feet.

- 6. There would not be any work required on the east side of Union Road. Pedestrians would use the existing paved shoulder.
- 7. No work would be required on South Creek Drive.
- 8. A traffic signal would not be approved at this time.
- 9. It would not be necessary to overlay the existing pavement as required in Project Phase III. The pavement would be only widened on the west side about 10 feet.
- 10. Signs and pavement markings would have to be modified accordingly.

Holiday-Union Associates is in agreement with these interim improvements.

Union Consumer Square

Councilman Johnson and the Holiday-Union Associates expressed agreement with comments contained in your letter with the following exceptions. Councilman Johnson will require that the interim improvements on Union Road be implemented rather than providing access to South Creek Drive.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into as of the 27 th. day of July, 1994 by and between TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, a domestic municipal corporation having its principal place of business at 3301 Broadway in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York ("Town"); and HENRY M. FRONCKOWIAK and ARLENE FRONCKOWIAK, residing at East Aurora, New York ("Fronckowiaks")

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Town is the owner of property known as John C. Stiglmeier Park located on Losson Foad in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York (hereinafter "Stiglmeier Park"), and

WHEREAS, the Franckowiaks are the owners of a mobile home park known as Parkside Village located on Crabapple Lane adjacent to Stiglmeier Park, and

WHEREAS, a berm and landscaping located in Stiglmeier Park separate Stiglmeier Park from Parkside Village, and

WHEREAS, the Fronckowiaks have offered to erect a six-foothigh vinyl-coated chain link fence at the foot of the aforementioned berm near the Parkside Village property line to discourage trespassers into Stiglmeier Park and Parkside Village,

Should the Town decide at some future date to move the fence for any reason, the Town would then, at its' own expense, move the fence to the property line of the Fronckowiaks', and ownership would then revert back to the Fronckowiaks. This agreement shall remain in force between the Town and any future owners of Parkside Village, should the property ever be sold by the Fronckowiaks.
- 4. The Fronckowiaks/ owners of Parkside Village shall maintain the Town-owned property located on the berm side of the fence by cutting the grass, weeds, etc. thereon.
- 5. The Town shall have no obligation or duty to maintain or repair the fence. Such repair and maintenance costs shall be borne by the owners of Parkside Village, and it is furthur understood that only employees of Parkside Village shall have authority to perform any needed maintenance.

Losson Green Estate Phase VIII

Applicant:

This site had been subject to a rezoning in 1992 and approved by the Town Board. At that time the applicant was rezoning the acreage from an apartment district to residential district for one and two family residences. At the time of submission Phase VIII consisted of 53 lots. The applicant at this time is now submitting a site plan showing 61 lots.

January, 1994, by and between the COUNTY OF ERIE, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, with offices at 95 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, 14202 hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY, party of the first part, and the TOWN/VILLAGE OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation of the State of New York in Erie County, with offices at BROADWAY & UNION RDS, CHEEKTOWAGA, New York 14227, hereinafter referred to as the MUNICIPALITY, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY, pursuant to the authority granted to it by Article 31 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, has established a special traffic options program for driving while intoxicated (STOP-DWI) and has formulated a plan thereunder for the coordination of county, town, city and village efforts to reduce alcohol-related traffic injuries and fatalities, and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY, through its police agency, has made formal application to the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator for the funding of certain alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities in Erie County during the period from January 1, 1994 to December 31, 1994, which application is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Appendix "A", and

WHEREAS, a Justice Court has been established in and for the MUNICIPALITY with jurisdiction to hear and determine cases involving alleged violations of Section 1192, Section 511(2)(a)(i) and (iii) and Section 511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

FIRST: The term of this Agreement shall be the COUNTY's fiscal year commencing January 1, 1994 and ending December 31, 1994. The said term shall be divided into the following quarterly periods:

January 1 to March 31; April 1 to June 30; July 1 to September 30; and October 1 to December 31.

SECOND: During the term of this Agreement, the MUNICI-PALITY, as an independent contractor, agrees to engage in the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in the annexed Appendix "A".

THIRD:

- A. For purposes of this paragraph:
 - (i) "DWI case" shall mean a criminal action commenced in any court within Erie County wherein a person is charged with a violation of Section 1192, Section 511(2)(a)(i) or (iii) or Section 511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law;

- (ii) "net STOP-DWI collections" shall mean the amount of fines, penalties and forfeitures collected by any court, judge, magistrate or other judicial officer within Erie County for violations of Section 1192, Section 511(2)(a)(i) or (iii) or Section 511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law after deducting therefrom the amount of refunds made by reason of judicial mandate (e.g., appellate reversal of conviction, reduction of fine, etc.) or pursuant to former Section 521(c) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law (e.g., upon successful completion of an alcohol and drug rehabilitation program) and after deducting therefrom the percentage or amount withheld for deposit to the credit of the state STOP-DWI coordinating fund or for state operating and administrative expenses (i.e., any state assessment against fine revenues otherwise payable to Erie County pursuant to Section 1197(1) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law).
- B. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each of the quarterly periods of this Agreement, the County agrees to pay the MUNICIPALITY, subject to the provisions of paragraph FOURTH (C) hereof, a sum not to exceed the lesser of either:

- (i) the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses, as certified by the MUNICIPALITY upon forms acceptable to the COUNTY, in carrying out, during such quarterly period, the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in Appendix "A"; or
- (ii) sixty-five percent (65%) of the net

 STOP-DWI collections actually paid over
 and received by the COUNTY during such
 quarterly period, provided that such
 collections have resulted from convictions obtained in DWI cases commenced
 by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency.
- C. Where in any quarterly period, the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses, as certified in (i) above, exceed sixty-five percent (65%) of the amount of net STOP-DWI collections attributable to the MUNICIPALITY's alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities, as calculated pursuant to (ii) above, such excess amount shall be added to the MUNICIPALITY's certified actual expenses in the next succeeding quarterly period for purposes of determining the sum payable to the MUNICIPALITY under this paragraph.

FOURTH:

- A. For purposes of this paragraph:
 - (i) "DWI case" shall mean a criminal action commenced in any court within Erie

County wherein a person is charged with a violation, or multiple violations involving the same person and arising out of the same incident, of Section 1192, Section 511(2)(a)(i) or (iii) or Section 511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law;

- (ii) "finally disposed of" and "final disposition" shall mean the termination of a DWI case at the trial court level by reason of a dismissal, acquittal or conviction and imposition of sentence by the trial court, but shall not include the removal or transfer of a DWI case to another court.
- B. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each of the quarterly periods of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees to pay the MUNICIPALITY, for the services of the MUNICIPALITY's Justice Court, the sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) for each DWI case finally disposed of in such court during such quarterly period which was commenced by either the Erie County Sheriff's Department or the New York State Police. The said sum shall be payable by the COUNTY for each such DWI case regardless of the final disposition thereof.
- C. The MUNICIPALITY agrees that the COUNTY, on behalf of the MUNICIPALITY, shall allocate and pay out, from the sums payable quarterly to the MUNICIPALITY under paragraph THIRD (B) hereof, the

sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) for each DWI case commenced by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency which was finally disposed of during the corresponding quarterly period. The said sum shall be paid by the COUNTY to the town or village in whose Justice Court the DWI case was finally disposed of and shall be payable regardless of the final disposition thereof.

FIFTH:

- A. The MUNICIPALITY, through its police agency, agrees to compile information and render monthly reports to the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator with respect to:
 - (i) the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses in carrying out the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in Appendix "A". A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Fiscal Cost Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "B";
 - (ii) all alcohol-related traffic accidents investigated by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency (including copies of MV-104A forms prepared in connection therewith). A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Accident Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "C"; and
 - (iii) all DWI cases [cases involving alleged violation(s) of Section 1192, Section 511(2) (a)(i) or (iii) or Section 511(3) of the

Vehicle and Traffic Law] commenced by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency in any court in Erie County. A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Arrest Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "D".

- B. The MUNICIPALITY, through its Justice Court with jurisdiction to hear and determine DWI cases, agrees to compile information and render monthly reports to the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator with respect to all DWI cases finally disposed of [as those terms are defined in paragraph FOURTH (A)(i) and (ii), but including cases removed or transferred] in the MUNICIPALITY's Justice Court. A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Court Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "E".
- C. The MUNICIPALITY acknowledges that the determination by the COUNTY of the amounts payable to the MUNICIPALITY under paragraph THIRD and FOURTH of this Agreement is dependent upon the timely receipt by the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator of accurate information from the MUNICIPALITY. Accordingly, the MUNICIPALITY agrees that, as a condition precedent to its rights to payment under this Agreement, it shall fully complete and forward to the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator each of the monthly reports required under this paragraph (Appendices "B", "C", "D" and "E"; together with MV-104A copies) within 15 days after the last day of each monthly period to which such reports relate.

SIXTH: This Agreement is executory only to the extent of moneys available to the COUNTY for the performance hereof and appropriated therefor, being moneys in a separate account entitled "Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated" established and funded pursuant to Sections 1197 and 1803 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, and the COUNTY shall incur no liability on account of this Agreement beyond such moneys.

SEVENTH: In the event the Erie County STOP-DWI Program, as approved by the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, is terminated before the COUNTY has paid to the MUNICIPALITY all of the sums otherwise payable under the terms of this Agreement, the provisions of Section 1197(9) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law with respect to program cessation shall govern for purposes of determining the availability of such sums for payment to the MUNICIPALITY.

EIGHTH: The MUNICIPALITY shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or of any right, title or interest therein, nor of the power to execute the same or any extension thereof to any other person or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the COUNTY.

NINTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to comply with all applicable laws of the State of New York, the United States and the County of Erie, including laws against discrimination, and with all rules and regulations of pertinent authorities having jurisdiction.

TENTH: The MUNICIPALITY shall be fully accountable for its performance under this Agreement and agrees for itself and its

officers to answer under oath all questions relevant to the performance thereof and to any transaction, act or omission in connection therewith if called before any Judicial, County, State or Federal agency empowered to investigate the Agreement or its performance.

ELEVENTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to furnish verified accounts of its disbursements hereunder, with certified or verified invoices thereto attached at such times and in such form and detail as may be required by the Erie County Comptroller, who may at her option audit the pertinent books and records of the MUNICIPALITY, and a final account within thirty (30) days after the termination of this Agreement.

TWELFTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify the COUNTY against any and all liability, claims, demands, suits and judgments arising out of the performance of the MUNICIPALITY's obligations under this Agreement. The MUNICIPALITY further agrees to maintain insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement and to submit certificates of insurance in accordance with Vendor Classification C - "Professional Services", on Appendix "F" annexed hereto. For purposes of this Agreement, the MUNICIPALITY need not provide proof of professional liability insurance coverage. At the request of the MUNICIPALITY and with the advice of the Erie County Attorney, the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator may waive the excess and/or umbrella liability insurance coverage(s), or reduce the amount(s) thereof, otherwise required under this paragraph in lieu of proof of insurance coverage, the MUNICIPALITY may

furnish evidence of a self-insurance plan acceptable to the Erie County Attorney.

THIRTEENTH: Consistent with the MUNICIPALITY's status as an independent contractor, the COUNTY shall not be responsible for Worker's Compensation benefits, Social Security coverage or unemployment insurance benefits with respect to the MUNICIPALITY.

FOURTEENTH: This Agreement, or any renewal thereof, may be terminated by either party upon at least thirty (30) days prior notice. Such notice shall be provided in writing to the chief executive officer of the other party at the address appearing on the first page of this Agreement.

FIFTEENTH: Provided that the MUNICIPALITY shall have made formal application for the continued funding of its alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities, this Agreement may be renewed for such additional twelve (12) month terms as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties through their respective legislative bodies.

This Agreement is executed by the COUNTY pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Legislature of the County of Erie at its meeting held on December 7, 1993, and by the MUNICIPALITY pursuant to a resolution of its governing body adopted at a meeting of said governing body held on September 6, 1994, of the MUNICIPALITY's resolution being annexed hereto as Appendix "G".

I. PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION AND ANALYSIS.

- a) Statistics comparison:
 - 1. Total number of motor vehicle accidents in the Town of Cheektowaga 1992-2,633, 1993-2383. This is a decrease of 9.49%.
 - 2. Total number of DWI arrests; 1992-395, 1993-305. This is a decrease of 23%.
 - 3. Number of motor vehicle accidents where a DWI arrest was made. 1992-115, 1993-83 (51% property damage, 49% injury). This is a decrease of 28%.

 The percentage of accidents where a DWI arrest was made was 3.48%.
 - 4. Total number of VTL arrests; 1992-10,019, 1993-6737. This is a decrease of 33%.
 - 5. Percentage of DWI arrests where an accident was involved; 1992-29% 1993-27%.
 - 6. The above statistics represent the reported accidents only. The number of intoxicated or alcohol impaired drivers that went undetected is unknown.
- b) Identification of problem.
 - The percentage of DWI related accidents in the Town of Cheektowaga was 3.48% in 1993, for a total of 83 accidents where a DWI arrest was made out of a total of 2,383 accidents.
 - 2. The percentage of DWI arrests where an accident was involved was 27% or 83 of the total 305 DWI arrests.
 - 3. While the number of DWI arrests has decreased, 305 DWI arrests were made and this number is still unacceptable.

c) Analysis.

- Although the accidents involving driving while intoxicated has been decreasing, the numbers still show a need to further reduce alcohol related injury and damage.
- 2. The total number of accidents decreased by 9.48%, this is very possibily due to the increased selective enforcement of DWI laws.
- The investigation of accidents is an essential part of identification and removal of intoxicated drivers from our highways.
- 4. Increased training of officers in identification of alcohol impaired/intoxicated drivers increases the number of arrests possible at accidents and vehicle stops.
- 5. Increased selective enforcement has a positive effect on reducing the number of accidents in the short term, selective enforcement and education have a longer term effect.

II. PROGRAM GOALS AND OBJECTIVES.

- 1. To reduce the total number of accidents in the Town of Cheektowaga by 10%.
- 2. To reduce the number of accidents involving DWIs by 5% in the Town of Cheektowaga.
- 3. To increase the number of DWI arrests by 10%.

III. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION.

- Assign one traffic officer to DWI patrol enforcement. The purpose of the patrol will be to identify and arrest impaired/intoxicated drivers on our highways.
- 2. The officers will be assigned in addition to the normal traffic enforcement provided by the Cheektowaga Police Department.
- 3. The officers will be assigned seven days a week, between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 5:00 A.M.
- 4. Officers will receive training in identification and handling of both alcohol and drug impaired or intoxicated drivers. This training will be updated periodically.
- 5. This patrol will work in conjunction with accident investigation, radar speed enforcement, and routine vehicle and traffic law enforcement.
- 6. Officers will also be assigned to community DWI awareness programs. These programs will concentrate on young drivers in the 16 to 21 year old group.
- 7. Officers will also participate in STOP-DWI checkpoints and/or saturation patrols.





A wetlands delineation was performed and federal wetlands on the site are under an acre and the applicant is therefore seeking, from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, permission under a "National 26" permit to develop the wetlands.

A tree survey was performed and the conclusion of the consulting firm was that the trees were young and in generally poor condition. Some would be saved and additional landscaping has been approved by the Planning Board.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has indicated that the project will have no impact on their highway.

The applicant would adhere to any conditions, from the Erie County Highway Department, made part of the Losson Road curb cut.

The drainage plan is satisfactory to the Town Engineer.

Galleria Corners

Proposed Retail Store and Restuarant

Applicant:

Benderson Development

The applicant is proposing to construct a 16,100 square foot retail building and a 68-seat restaurant with drive-thru. A new plan has been submitted which shows two access driveways, one to Union Road and one to Galleria Drive. These driveways will be two-way/all-movement driveways and this project has been reviewed by the New York State DOT. They have concluded that this project will not have an impact upon their highway system.

The new plan reflects the installation of sidewalks along both Union Road and Galleria Drive, the minimum landscaping as required by the Zoning Law, and the shift of the retail building in an effort to save some of the existing trees that are located at the southwest corner of the property.

The area is presently zoned for retail business (which includes restaurant) and the use is compatible with existing and projected uses for the general vicinity.

The restaurant would be located closest to Union Road and would have a drive thru with stacking for nine cars. It was suggested to the applicant that signage be placed at the Union Road driveway prohibiting left turns onto Union Road. This signage would be placed on private property and would not be police-enforceable since the New York State DOT would not prohibit left turns out of the site.

This final site plan will be reviewed by the Town Planning Board and by the Town Traffic Saftey Commission.

It was noted to the applicant that they must adjust their parking to come into compliance with the Zoning Law requirements. At the present time they are short one parking space and must change their access aisles for the handicap parking spaces. This change to the handicap access aisles may affect their parking requirements.

The committee is recommending that the Town Board issue a Negative Declaration for this project.

Losson and Transit

Proposed Boston Rotisserie Chicken

Applicant:

Benderson Development

The site is at the southwest corner of Losson Road Transit and is a 1.2 acre parcel. This parcel had been broken off from a larger site that had at one time been the site of a proposed Bell's Supermarket. The restaurant would have seating for 52 people and be approximately 3,000 square feet. The applicant was told that the plan must show sidewalks for Losson Road and Transit and that additional plans must be brought in with regard to drainage and sanitary sewerage. In addition, landscaping must be reviewed by the Planning Board and a tree survey and wetlands study must be submitted. The applicant indicated that the tree survey and wetlands have been completed but not received.
